

## Jack King MBE MA 1928-2007

Jack Naisbitt King gave outstanding services to Wolfson College as Founding Fellow (1965-1995), Bursar (1968-1979), Director of the Wolfson Course (1979-1994), Vice-President (1984-1988), Senior Fellow (1984-1995), and Honorary Fellow (1995-2007). He served as Senior Proctor of the University of Cambridge (1991-1992).
