University of Cambridge Vice-Chancellor

On 26 September, international law scholar and university leader Professor Stephen Toope was nominated as the 346th Vice-Chancellor of the University of Cambridge. Subject to the approval of the University's governing body, the Regent House, Professor Toope will take over from Wolfson's own Professor Sir Leszek Borysiewicz on 1 October 2017. During his final year as Vice-Chancellor, Sir Leszek will also take up a new post as Chairman of Cancer Research UK.

President's latest book

Professor Sir Richard Evans' latest book, The Pursuit of Power, draws on a lifetime of thinking about nineteenthcentury Europe to create an extraordinarily rich, surprising and entertaining panorama of a continent undergoing drastic transformation. The book aims to reignite the sense of wonder that permeated this remarkable era, as rulers and ruled navigated overwhelming cultural, political and technological changes. It was a time where what was seen as modern with amazing speed appeared old-fashioned, where huge cities sprang up in a generation, new European countries were created and where, for the first time, humans could communicate almost instantly over thousands of miles. In the period bounded by the Battle of Waterloo and the outbreak of World War I, Europe dominated the rest of the world as never before or since: this book breaks new ground by showing how the continent shaped, and was shaped by, its interactions with other parts of the globe.
